

Showy flowers are held in long, upright panicles about a foot tall. Stamens are long and obvious, extending out from the flowers.



Individual flowers are tubular and slightly irregular with white petals. The long, exerted stamens can be seen in this close-up. Anthers are red.



The fruit is a smooth, ovoid dehiscent capsule that splits open at maturity to reveal 2 to 3 shiny, brown seeds.



The opposite leaves are palmately compound with 5 to 7 leaflets. The leaflets have finely serrated margins.

Bottlebrush buckeye (page 2 of 2)

Form is often broad spreading due to the colony-forming nature of this shrub.
Here is the whole shrub in flower.



Buds are imbricate, relatively large, with 4 to 6 scales.



Leaf scars are large and shield shaped.



Fall color is yellow.
