Arrowwood Viburnum (page 1 of 2)

Arrowwood viburnum produces small (1/3 inch), blue drupes in cymes

The opposite leaves are simple, with sharply toothed margins. Each leaf has 6 to 10 pairs of impressed veins.

The light brown, imbricate buds are slightly curved. Lenticels are scattered along the stem.

Arrowwood viburnum is a multi-stemmed shrub. The species can grow up to 8 feet tall and 6 to 8 feet wide.
