



The inflorescence is an umbel. The stalk that holds the umbel bends over so the inflorescence is nodding.

Pinkish-white flowers; perfect, with 6 tepals; the 6 stamens are longer than the tepals and protrude. Flowers are small (1/4"); held in groups of 40-60. The pedicel (stalk) of each flower may be green or purplish

Fruits are capsules, each containing a number of small black seeds. The capsules split open at maturity.
