

Individual flowers are tiny and packed onto a fleshy, spike-like inflorescence called a spadix. The spadix is surrounded by a structure called a spathe (the 'pulpit') which is green in the left picture and striped in the right picture. Flowers may be all male or all female and a particular plant that had female flowers last year may be male this year.
