Marsh marigold (page 1 of 1)


The perfect flowers are solitary or in small clusters. The petal-like sepals are bright yellow; a group of pistils in the center is surrounded by numerous stamens in a ring.



Fruits are small elongated follicles in a ring.



The form is loosely mounded; about 1 ½ feet tall.



There are both basal leaves and alternate leaves on the stems. They are kidney-shaped to nearly circular, with a shallowly toothed margin and deeply indented (cordate) base.
