

*Erythronium americanum*

Yellow Trout Lily (page 1 of 1)

The flowers are solitary. Each one has 6 yellow tepals, with pale brown shading on the back. The flower nods, the tepals are strongly recurved and the gender parts extend out of the flower.



The fruits are oval capsules.



The basal leaves are strappy, with entire margins. They are mottled with green and brown. The surface of the leaf is glabrous and waxy.



Individual flowering plants (left) have two basal leaves. Height is 4 to 6 inches. Plants too young to flower have only one leaf. Plants often occur in large groups (right).
